#### (PUBLIC INFORMATION)

# TO THE SOUTH CAROLINA OPERATIONAL RADIOLOGICAL EMERGENCY RESPONSE PLAN)

#### I. INTRODUCTION

- A. Dissemination of complete and accurate information to the public in South Carolina in the event of a Nuclear Power Plant (NPP) incident is essential to promote a controlled response by the population and to instill confidence that necessary actions are being undertaken for the public's health and safety.
- B. The public, through the news media, will look to government and the affected facility for emergency instructions and continuing information regarding the incident.
- C. Federal, state and local governments and the affected facility will establish a Joint Information System (JIS) where representatives can respond to media inquiries and ensure an orderly and coordinated release of emergency information.

### II. PURPOSE

- A. Provide for direction and control in the dissemination of official statements, information (i.e., news releases), and Emergency Alert System (EAS) messages by State Government during a NPP incident.
- B. Provide for effective communication and coordination with federal, local and NPP/utility emergency public information organizations to ensure accurate and orderly dissemination of emergency information during a NPP incident.
- C. Provide for the effective utilization of state public information resources during a NPP incident
- D. Ensure coordination with federal, State, local and NPP/utility public information organizations in the dissemination of emergency information during a NPP incident.

#### III. CONCEPT OF OPERATIONS

- A. The Government of the State of South Carolina will exercise primary responsibility and authority for the release of information relating to the off-site impact of an NPP incident, requirements for off-site protective actions, activation of the EAS, and operational/technical activities of state response forces.
- B. The State of South Carolina will organize and respond to the public information requirements stemming from an event at a NPP in accordance with Section VII (Disaster Intelligence and Communications) of the South Carolina Emergency Operations Plan (SCEOP), and Annex 15 (Public Information) of the SCEOP.
- C. Direction and Control

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- 1. If the State Emergency Operations Center (SEOC) is activated as a result of a NPP incident, the Governor's Press Secretary or designee [normally the South Carolina Emergency Management Division (SCEMD) Public Information Director] will address issues regarding public safety and state the government's response.
- 2. Direction and control of State Public Information operations will be in accordance with Section VII (Disaster Intelligence and Communications) of the SCEOP, Annex 15 (Public Information) of the SCEOP, and the ESF-15 (Public Information) Standard Operating Procedures (SOP).

#### D. Coordination

- 1. ESF-15 (Public Information) will coordinate public information and EAS activities at the SEOC or Joint Information Center (JIC) in accordance with Section VII (Disaster Intelligence and Communications) of the SCEOP, Annex 15 (Public Information) of the SCEOP, and the ESF-15 (Public Information) SOP.
- 2. ESF-15 (Public Information) will coordinate all information prior to its release with the NPP/utility to the fullest extent practicable. Timely release of emergency information to South Carolina's populace will be of paramount importance.
- 3. ESF-15 (Public Information) will schedule briefing to provide the media with periodic updates on the incident and will release additional information as it becomes available, as required by the urgency of the situation, or to clarify misinformation and rumors.

### E. Public Inquiry/Rumor Control

ESF-15 (Public Information) will coordinate responses to requests for public information, and gather and respond to rumors, in accordance with Section VII (Disaster Intelligence and Communications) of the SCEOP, Annex 15 (Public Information) of the SCEOP, and the ESF-15 (Public Information) SOP.

#### IV. RESPONSIBILITIES

#### A. State Government

- 1. State government will exercise primary responsibility and authority for the release of information relating to the off-site impact of an NPP incident, requirements for off-site protective actions, activation of the EAS, and operational/technical activities of state response forces.
- 2. State government will conduct public information operations in accordance with Section VII (Disaster Intelligence and Communications) of the SCEOP,

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- Annex 15 (Public Information) of the SCEOP, and the ESF-15 (Public Information) SOP.
- 3. SCEMD will coordinate an annual media program to acquaint news media with emergency plans/procedures, information concerning radiation, and points of contact for release of public information in an emergency. This can be done by meeting with, or mailing information to, media representatives.

### B. County Governments

- 1. Alert the public.
- 2. Implement off-site protective actions as directed by proper authority.
- 3. Release information relating to operational activities of local response forces within their jurisdiction.
- 4. Provide an authorized spokesperson/representative to support county public information activities through the JIS.
- 5. Conduct public information activities in accordance with established plans.

### C. NPP/Utility

- 1. Release information relating to on-site conditions and response activities resulting from the incident.
- 2. Provide an Emergency News Center and its appropriate administrative and logistical support.
- 3. Provide an authorized spokesperson/representative to support public information activities at the State JIC, or interface with the State JIS.
- 4. Determine credentials of news media representatives and establish access control to the Emergency News Center.
- 5. Conduct public information and public education activities in accordance with established plans.

#### D. Federal Government

- 1. Release information relating to on-site regulatory and off-site support activities of federal response forces.
- 2. Provide an authorized spokesperson/representative to support federal public information activities at the State JIC.
- 3. Conducting public information activities in accordance with established plans.

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### V. ADMINISTRATION AND LOGISTICS

### A. Location of the State JIC

- 1. State Emergency Operations Center, 2779 Fish Hatchery Road, West Columbia, SC 29172
- 2. The Press Secretary, the Director or designee may determine an alternate location based on current conditions.

## B. Emergency News Center

- 1. The NPP/utility will provide the Emergency News Center and appropriate administrative, logistical and equipment support to public information and media staff.
- 2. The NPP/Utility will furnish telephone and internet support at the Emergency News Center.

- D. Public information communications support will be requested from the SEOC, as required.

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#### ATTACHMENT A: EMERGENCY PUBLIC INFORMATION TO SCORERP

### I. INTRODUCTION

- A. Dissemination of complete and accurate information promptly to the public in the event of a nuclear facility incident is essential to promote a controlled response by the population and instill confidence that necessary actions are being undertaken for the public health and safety.
- B. In order for the public to have a clearer understanding of instructions and other information released during the course of an incident; related information must be made available prior to such a situation.
- C. The SCEMD Public Information Section, in coordination with federal and local governments and nuclear facilities located within the State, will develop and conduct a program of public education to address potential hazards resulting from an incident, appropriate actions for public self-protection, and information on state, local and facility radiological emergency response programs.

#### II. PURPOSE

- A. Provide the general public and transient population with appropriate educational information relating to: potential hazards resulting from a nuclear facility incident; state, local, and facility radiological emergency response programs; and appropriate actions for public self-protection in the event of an incident.
- B. Provide for the establishment, coordination, and conduct of an effective program of public education relating to:
  - 1. Potential hazards resulting from a nuclear facility/utility incident
  - 2. Appropriate actions for public self-protection in the event of an incident
  - 3. State, local and facility radiological emergency response programs

#### III. CONCEPT OF OPERATIONS

- A. The SCEMD Public Information Section will coordinate the conduct of program activities within the state.
- B. The SCEMD Public Information Section will coordinate the provision of necessary resources to support local program activities.
- C. County governments within the Plume Exposure Pathway EPZ will conduct ongoing programs and participate in annual special emphasis programs.
- D. FEMA and NPP public information organizations will augment the Public Information Section, as required, with appropriate staff to support incident response activities. Incident response activities will include:

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- 1. Identification of possible types of incidents to include potential health and environmental impacts
- 2. Means of public alert and notification
- 3. Appropriate actions for public self-protection
- 4. Sources of additional educational information prior to and during an emergency
- 5. Information relating to state, local, and NPP response plans including identification of evacuation sectors, routes, reception centers, provisions for sheltering, respiratory protection, and use of radio-protective drugs
- 6. Information relating to special segments of the population including schools, hospitals, nursing homes, other institutions and physically impaired, mentally impaired and transportation-dependent individuals
- E. Program activities will include ongoing programs and special emphasis programs conducted annually.
- F. Educational information will be disseminated through available public and private resources:
  - 1. Publications
  - 2. Printed and electronic media
  - 3. State displays and distribution of prepared literature at public locations
- G. Dissemination of information to the transient population will be accomplished by providing access to educational materials at appropriate locations, including:
  - 1. Facility visitors' centers
  - 2. Motel/hotel lobbies
  - 3. Train stations
  - 4. Parks
  - 5. Campgrounds
  - 6. Recreation areas
  - 7. Other public areas

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### IV. RESPONSIBILITIES

- A. Office of the Governor:
  - 1. Establish policy for the conduct of program activities.
  - 2. Provide appropriate staff assistance to support program activities.
- B. SCEMD Public Information Section:
  - 1. Coordinate the development and conduct of special statewide educational programs with the appropriate supporting organizations.
  - 2. Provide staff and material assistance to support the conduct of local ongoing programs.
  - 3. Acquire or develop special educational materials.
  - 4. Coordinate with Support Agencies to provide staff, facility, equipment, and material assistance to support the development and conduct of public education program activities.
- C. County Emergency Preparedness Agencies
  - 1. Coordinate the conduct of local educational programs.
  - 2. Participate in annual special emphasis programs.
- D. NPPs/Utilities and DHS FEMA:
  - 1. Provide staff and material assistance to support program activities.
  - 2. Participate in annual special emphasis programs.

# LIVESTOCK OWNERS SHOULD TAKE PROTECTIVE MEASURES DUE TO RADIOACTIVE RELEASE

#### **LACTATING DAIRY COWS:**

- Should be removed from contaminated pastures and sheltered indoors.
- Should be fed uncontaminated, stored feed and water.
- If limited man-made structures are available for sheltering pastured livestock, lactating dairy cows should be sheltered first.
- Lactating dairy cows receiving only stored feed under dry lot conditions can remain on dry lot. Stored feeds are silage, as is hay not stored in the open field and concentrates.

#### BEEF CATTLE AND OTHER MEAT-PRODUCING LIVESTOCK:

- Should be removed from contaminated pasture if facilities and uncontaminated feeds are available.
- It is not necessary at this time to move pastured livestock into shelters: however, it is suggested that pastured livestock be moved to pastures in close proximity to shelters in order that the livestock can be moved into the shelters quickly if it becomes necessary to do so.

### SWINE:

- Breeding stock (boars, sows, and gilts) maintained on pasture should be moved from contaminated pasture, sheltered and fed uncontaminated stored feed and water.
- Sows and pigs in farrowing houses or hogs being finished in confinement should not be moved from barns.

#### POULTRY:

 Poultry should be maintained in houses and fed uncontaminated stored feed and water. This applies to both egg and meat-producing birds.



RESIDENTS NEAR NUCLEAR STATION SHOULD INGEST POTASSIUM IODIDE
COLUMBIA, S.C. – Residents within ten miles of the Nuclear Station should now ingest the potassium iodide tablets that they were issued. The South Carolina Emergency Management Division reports utility officials have declared a/an (SITE AREA EMERGENCY, GENERAL EMERGENCY) at the nuclear power plant in, SC.
There has been a release of radioactive material to the environment There is NO release of radioactive material to the environment
South Carolina Department of Health and Environmental Control (DHEC) officials advise residents near Nuclear Station to take potassium iodide tablets because they are used to protect the thyroid gland in the event of a radiation emergency. Individuals who were not issued potassium iodide tablets or who have lost them may obtain potassium iodide tablets at a county reception center or shelter. Individuals should follow the instructions that came with the potassium iodide tablets and take only the appropriate dosage at this time.
Often identified by its chemical symbol (KI), potassium iodide is a non-prescription medication that, if taken within the appropriate time and at the appropriate dosage, blocks the thyroid gland's uptake of radioactive iodine. While considered safe for most people, potassium iodide can cause minor side effects such as gastrointestinal disturbances and rashes. Individuals who are allergic to shellfish, seafood, or iodine should not take potassium iodide.
DHEC officials said the public should be aware that potassium iodide is not a magic "anti-radiation" pill. It provides protection for ONLY the thyroid gland against one form of radiation. It does not provide protection against whole body irradiation or other forms of radioactive elements that could result from a nuclear power plant release.
