## PURPOSE

The State of South Carolina pursues a coordinated strategy in order to sustain and improve its capacity to save lives and protect property in the event of a disaster. Capabilities-based planning, supported by a robust and relevant training and exercise cycle, is a critical component of this strategy. The State’s emergency preparedness training and exercise program is coordinated by the South Carolina Emergency Management Division (SCEMD), in cooperation with the South Carolina Law Enforcement Division (SLED) and many other public and private-sector stakeholders. This schedule is designed to prepare the State to optimally address the natural, man-made, and technical hazards it may face.

This Multi-Year Schedule of Preparedness Activities provides the State with opportunities to validate, refine and improve existing capabilities, as well as attain and develop new ones based on gaps and needs identified throughout the cycle. The schedule supports South Carolina’s Homeland Security and Emergency Management strategies. It defines a comprehensive cycle of training and exercises that will sustain and improve core capabilities upon which the State must focus in order to meet critical objectives.

Included in the Multi-Year Schedule of Preparedness Activities is the training and exercise schedule outlining proposed activities from January 2022 through December 2024. This three-year cycle represents a logical progression of specific, measurable, achievable, relevant and time-bound training and exercises which support the “building-block” approach.

The Multi-Year Schedule of Preparedness Activities is a living document, updated quarterly and revised annually. It fulfills SCEMD’s and SLED’s obligation to provide annual training guidance to county and local emergency management offices and state agencies in accordance with Emergency Management Performance Grant (EMPG) requirements.

This plan addresses State and local priorities, gaps and deficiencies identified during previous exercises and activations. It also reflects data collected over the course of the 2021 Integrated Preparedness Planning Workshop (IPPW) cycle. Workshops held in each of South Carolina’s six emergency management regions from April through August 2021 focused on local and regional capabilities-based planning. The State IPPW, conducted on September 2, 2021, focused on State and Federal agencies, the State Emergency Response Team (SERT), the Regional Response Teams (RRT) and other public and private stakeholders supporting key life-line sectors and Emergency Support Functions (ESF’s).

## PREPAREDNESS PRIORITIES

### State of South Carolina

SLED, in conjunction with SCEMD and other State agencies, conducts an annual Threat, Hazard Identification and Risk Assessment (THIRA) and Stakeholders' Preparedness Review (SPR) for the State of South Carolina. The THIRA/SPR identifies and analyzes threats, risks and vulnerabilities. Using this assessment, the Homeland Security Strategy, and data collected from the previous training and exercise cycle, the State has identified five priorities and associated core capabilities on which to focus its planning, organization, equipment acquisition, training, and exercises.

## Prevention of and/or Protection from Terrorist Attacks and Associated Crimes

The *National Prevention Framework*, second edition, June 2016, provides guidance to individuals and communities, the private and nonprofit sectors, faith-based organizations, and all levels of government (local, regional/metropolitan, state, tribal, territorial, and Federal) to prevent, avoid, or stop a threatened or actual act of terrorism by

- Describing the core capabilities needed to prevent an imminent act of terrorism;
- Aligning key roles and responsibilities to deliver Prevention capabilities in time-sensitive situations;
- Describing coordinating structures that enable all stakeholders to work together; and
- Laying the foundation for further operational coordination and planning that will synchronize Prevention efforts within the whole community and across the Protection, Mitigation, Response, and Recovery mission areas.

The desired end-state of the Prevention mission area is a Nation optimally prepared to prevent an imminent terrorist attack within the United States. To achieve this end-state, the National Prevention Framework sets out three principles that guide the development and execution of the core capabilities for Prevention: (1) Engaged Partnerships; (2) Scalability, Flexibility, and Adaptability; and (3) Readiness to Act.

## Mitigation of Hazards

Disasters can cause loss of life, damage to buildings and infrastructure, and have devastating consequences for a community's economic, social, and environmental well-being. Hazard mitigation reduces disaster damages and is defined as sustained action taken to reduce or eliminate the long-term risk to human life and property from hazards. Outreach programs that increase risk awareness, projects to protect critical facilities, and the removal of structures from flood hazard areas are all examples of mitigation actions. Local mitigation actions and concepts can also be incorporated into land use plans and building codes.
